King of the Jungle?

The lion is often referred to as "The King of the Jungle." However, the majority of lions don't live in the jungle. They live in the savannahs of Africa. A savannah is a large, flat grassland. They have scattered shrubs but very few trees.

Savannahs don't get enough rain for a thick forest to grow. In fact, the tall grass that does grow there is often beige, not green. Lions are a similar tawny color. Lions often hide in savannah grass while hunting their prey. If lions lived in jungles, their light taupe color wouldn't offer much camouflage.

If lions did live in jungles, they'd have some tough competition for the title of "King of the Jungle": Tigers.

The only tigers living in Africa are in zoos, nature preserves or as pets. Tigers are not native to Africa. Most tigers live in Asia.

The tiger's orange fur is striped with black or brown. These stripes are on the tiger's skin, as well. You might think a tiger's coloring would stand out in the jungle. Not so. Jungle trees cast strips of shadow onto the forest floor. The tiger's stripes help the large cat blend in with the sunshine and shadows of the jungle.

If the lion and tiger had to fight for the title of king, who would win?

Tigers are much heavier than lions. Tigers can weigh up to 800 pounds. Male lions typically weigh 550 pounds. Also, a tiger's weight is almost all muscle. So physically, tigers have the advantage. But don't count the lion out of the fight just yet.

Lions live in groups called prides. Female groups do the hunting. Male lions fight as a group to defend their territory from any intruder. Tigers are more **solitary**. As cubs, they live with their mother for 2 years. After that, they prefer to live alone. When it comes to hunting and fighting, each tiger fends for himself. So, one-on-one, a tiger would probably win against a lion. But in terms of combat strategy, a group of fighting lions could likely take down a single tiger.

It's pretty hard to say who is the real "King". I guess you'll need to decide for yourself!
